Dear Parent / Guardian,

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for the tremendous effort that you have made to keep our school community safe in these unprecedented times. You are adhering to the drop off and pick up points and times, are following social distancing rules and only entering the school building for a prearranged meeting.

We greatly appreciate this and would ask you to continue supporting us by ensuring you:

- 1. Wear a mask when dropping off/ picking up your child.
- 2. Leave the school grounds quickly and avoid prolonged conversations with other parents.
- 3. Provide your child with their break/lunch. There has been an increase in parents leaving break/lunch to the office. We are unable to send these safely to classrooms.
- 4. Let your child knows how they are getting home after school, as we are unable to relay messages to classrooms.
- 5. Seesaw the class teacher if a child needs to leave school early for an appointment.
- 6. Inform the school if anyone in your household has symptoms or if your child has to self isolate. This can be done via Seesaw to the class teacher or by email to fionaboyd66@hotmail.com.

If your child or anyone in the household has symptoms, please keep your child at home until a test can be carried out. If your child has vomiting or diarrhea, they must remain home for 48 hours. If you need advice on whether a child should be in school or not, please do not hesitate to contact me.

Homework

We are trying to make school as normal as possible and children are now bringing home homework and from this week will be bringing home a reading book. We would ask you to send your children into school with a schoolbag, which can be sprayed with disinfectant each night. In school, we will be following guidelines with regard to hygiene and quarantining books.

Homework will be a mixture of online and written work. It is essential that children complete both online and written homework because if a bubble has to close or the school goes into lockdown again, the children and you, as parents, need to be aware of how to use our online platforms. If any parent has difficulty accessing the online work or accessing devices, please contact me.

Parent Meetings

We were due to have parent meetings on the 23rd November but due to the pandemic and social distancing, we have had to postpone these to the second term. Therefore, children in P1-P6 will be in school on this day. We will however, still be holding the P7 parent meetings this term. The P7 teachers will send you further details.

Flu Vaccine

The administration of the Flu Vaccine will take place on the 23rd November. If you have not already returned your form, can you please do so.
