PRIMARY ONE ENROLMENT

Enrolment forms for parents wishing their child to begin P1 in September are now available from the office in Holy Trinity School. It is essential that you return your completed form along with your child's birth certificate and baptism lines (if the child was not baptised in Holy Trinity Church) to the school by Friday 11th January. We can only take in 90 children and over the past few years we have reached this quota. We feel that this is as a result of the excellent reputation Holy Trinity has both in and outside the community with regard to the excellent education

provided, the high level of pastoral care, sporting excellence, links with parents, high standards of behaviour etc.

All forms must be completed by the 11th January at 12.00 noon but we strongly urge you to get your form in as quickly as possible.

MLD UNIT INSPECTION

In December the Moderate Learning Difficulty Units in Holy Trinity went through a detailed and thorough inspection by the Department of Education. As well as observing classroom lessons, examining in detail the planning, assessments and paperwork and speaking at length to the staff, Principal and Vice Principal, she also talked to the children and examined their work. The Inspector was very impressed with all that she saw and awarded Holy Trinity the highest award possible "Outstanding". She praised the high standard of work, the excellent integration process, the high quality teaching and learning taking place, the meticulous planning and record keeping, the excellent training courses provided and the supportive management of the school. PARENTS' ROOM

Last year we had to close the Parents' Room as some parents were not supervising their children when using it. The Parents' Room will re-open Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday (not Thursday) from 1.30-2.00 to facilitate parents who have a child in nursery and Holy Trinity. If parents fail to supervise their children it will close again.

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Touch, Type, Read Spell (TTRS) Literacy programme.

Holy Trinity Primary School has purchased the licence for the Touch, Type, Read, Spell (TTRS) Literacy programme. Research has shown that this computerised programme has led to great improvements in children's and adult's reading levels. It has proven to assist adults with specific difficulties such as dyslexia, literacy difficulties, memory problems etc and also help improve spelling, reading and fluency. TTRS is a unique multisensory (seeing, hearing, speaking, **touching**) computer-aided learning course to help improve literacy levels. Research has shown that adults who have taken part have noted a definite improvement in all areas of English and it has led to them being able to read, write and spell with greater accuracy. It involves the adult using the programme for one hour per week. They wear a set of head phones and follow the instructions of typing words which appear on the screen. Everyone starts at level one and works at their own pace. There is no teaching involved as it is all done by repeatedly typing words which are on the screen and said through the headphones. There is no need to have any ICT experience or any keyboard skills.
