Minister's Visit

On Wednesday 3rd of June Holy Trinity Primary School welcomed Mr John O'Dowd, Minister for Education, to present the 'ICT Mark'. Three years ago we were the first school in Belfast to be awarded this accolade, in recognition of the sterling work which takes place in Holy Trinity within the area of ICT. Holy Trinity is committed ensuring your children to are developing the ICT knowledge and skills to equip them for life in the 21st Century.

Four of our Primary 7 pupils, Aaron Skelly, Odhran Braham, Niamh Murtagh and Zara Conlon, gave a presentation outlining the work being done through the medium of ICT and introduced a photoroll of activities on the screen.

In her address Mrs Boyd thanked Mrs Rooney (ICT Co-ordinator) and Miss Harte (Assistant ICT Co-ordinator) for their invaluable efforts to keep Holy Trinity Primary School at the forefront of using technology to enhance the learning opportunities of our children. Mrs Boyd, commented, "On behalf of Holy Trinity Primary School, I am delighted to be awarded the ICT Mark.
