This is situated in front of the main entrance to the General Office. In the interests of our pupils' safety parents are asked not to use this car park as it is also the main walkway for our Primary One children to go and come from their classes.





Adverse Weather

If the school should have to close due to unforeseen worsening conditions during the day parents will receive a text message and information will be sent to broadcast on local media for parents to collect children.
