GAA NEWS

Holy Trinity PS is delighted to announce that we have recently been invited to be one of only 16 schools to be involved in Antrim GAA's '5 Star Centre Pilot Project'. This project has been planned and will be delivered in collaboration with St Mary's University College as part of the Gaelfast programme. The concept of the 5 Star Centre was devised by the GAA for primary schools with the aim of ensuring that all children receive 60 minutes of moderate to vigorous physical activity per week throughout the school year. Mr. McCrory and Mrs. McLaughlin attended the launch of the programme last Friday 18th January in St Mary's University College and will receive further training and resources to aid in the implementation and effective delivery of the programme in Holy Trinity PS.

HIVE HACKERS

We are very privileged once again this year to be involved in the PwC 'Hive Hackers' initiative which engages with six to 11 year olds and teachers at primary schools across the region to teach coding and technology, to the point where schools can design and code their own games. The P7 pupils will be involved in a 7 week programme which develops the skills of Coding; Sequencing, Loops, Debugging, Binary, Game Making, Digital Footprint and Interactive Story Making culminating in an awards ceremony to be held in The Waterfront Hall on Thursday 28th March 2019.

RADAR CENTRE

In January the Primary 7 pupils were invited to attend The RADAR centre (Risk Avoidance and Danger Awareness Resource). RADAR is Northern Ireland's first and only, life sized, interactive safety and life skills education centre. The children were challenged to think about how to keep themselves and others safe within a house, bus, train, social media,

court room and prison cell. This was a really fun, engaging and interactive day and each workshop was thoroughly enjoyed by pupils and staff alike. We hope our pupils will remember all the safety procedures as they move forward to secondary school.

ICT NEWS

Our January eSafety Code is 'Think Before You Buy'.

The children will be talking about 'in app purchasing' and the importance of asking an adult before they buy 'add ons' in a game or app.

SAFER INTERNET DAY 2019

Safer Internet Day was on Tuesday 5th February with the theme 'Together for a Better Internet.' Children have been learning all about consent and how important it is to get permission online. eSafetysaurus has been around the classes this week on a 'Permission Mission' and the children have been learning how to stay safe. They have been looking at the issues around giving and asking for online permission or consent.

MEDICS IN PRIMARY SCHOOLS

Our Primary Seven pupils are currently working with Medical students from Queen's University who are teaching about the various systems in the body. Over a sixweek programme, the children will learn about the various aspects of what makes a healthy body and the importance of nutrition. The children will then engage in a number of practical learning activities in order to further their understanding of the heart, lungs, skin, brains with an emphasis on developing their skills and capabilities.

SALTO

Our Primary One children are extending their gymnastics programme taking turns to visit the world famous SALTO Gym in Lisburn where they receive expert tuition in using a variety of apparatus like the rings, ropes, beams and climbing frames. These visits to SALTO which commence in February, help our children develop their gross motor skills, their fundamental movement skills and their general coordination.

PEACEFUL SCHOOLS INITIATIVE

On Friday 15th February Holy Trinity will again host students from St Mary's University, Halifax, Nova Scotia in Canada. This will be the 12th year that students from St Mary's have visited Belfast teaching conflict resolution strategies through classroom games and activities, passing on skills our pupils can

use. The Canadian students put a lot of time and effort into their lessons and fundraising for their trip to Belfast and we look forward to their visit.
